
Inspirations: Landscape Photography

Light and shadow considerations make for a striking photograph.




A beautiful frog's eye view of a waterfall!




A sinuous carpet of sweet purple




This shot tells the story about the built work and its relationship to the desert mountain landscape.



This one explores the relationship between indoors and outdoors.




Spiky cacti and a cloudless blue sky frame the building.

What a peek this house allows!




Love the composition and the bright white compliments of the sun!



I love the composition of this one as wellhaving students place trace paper over it and block out the main elements would be a great lesson in composition.




This is simply scrumptious.



A good lesson in night lighting and reflection.




Wild New England pink roses are given the credit they deserve.
